As an important step in my career development, I am interested in pursuing the Certified Utility Safety Professional (CUSP) certification. This is a utility-specific safety credential offered by the Utility Safety & Ops Leadership Network (USOLN), a non-profit organization formed in 2009 to advocate for a safe, secure and productive utility work environment. I am requesting your approval and funding to move forward with the certification process. Here are details about CUSP benefits, process, and costs.

## **Benefits of CUSP Certification:**

- It is the only utility-specific safety credential and was developed with the understanding of the unique challenges that utilities face.
- Designed to provide a career path and individual growth for employees and increased value for employers.
- Provides industry-wide professional recognition as a utility safety professional.
- Provides employers the assurance of an individual's broad knowledge, skills and abilities in the utility work environment when hiring or promoting.
- Creates a uniform standard of understanding utility safety regulations, competencies and task directed skills for both utility companies and their contractor partners.
- Recertification requirements encourage continued professional growth in the practice of utility safety leadership.

## Steps to becoming a CUSP:

- 1. Submit the CUSP application that is reviewed for eligibility.
- 2. Prepare for the CUSP exam by utilizing the optional CUSP Prep.
- 3. Register to take the CUSP exam base exam and one endorsement exam that you specialize in.

The CUSP certification program is available in an online format that eliminates travel costs, logistics, and time away from work. The costs shown below represent USOLN membership pricing.

- o \$155 <u>USOLN annual membership</u> fee (optional, costs go up for <u>non-members</u>)
- o \$60 Application Fee; \$80 for non-members
- o \$799 CUSP Prep (optional); \$999 for non-members
- o \$400 CUSP base exam and one endorsement exam; \$524 for non-members
- o \$1,414 Total for USOLN Members; \$1,603 for non-members

The recertification requirements for the CUSP credential include an annual maintenance fee of \$160 per year and a continuing professional development requirement.
